- Give full attention
- Observe reactions

LISTEN

- Active listening
- Caring & showing empathy
- Identify SMART goal

LINK

Practical assistance with

- Problemsolving
 - Help to access basic needs
- Refer to other resources for further assistance

WAIT...

- Why am I so tired?
- How long am I expected to keep coping?

Some Recommendations

- Accept feelings as a normal reaction to an abnormal situation
- Understand risk vs. ambiguity
- Do not assume the blame for the pandemic's effects on your career: We are all in the same storm
- Plan and stick to a setfare routine
- Stay connected to social group: walks, playding, morning coffee
- Give and accept kindness
- Interventions
 - ACT : Psychological flexibility
 - Committed action based in values
 - Mindfulness, grounding in present moment
