

GUIDELINES: DECLARATION OF POTENTIAL CONFLICT OF INTEREST

<u>The National Standard for Support of Accredited CPD Activities</u> (the National Standard) describes the process and requirements for gathering, managing, and disclosing conflicts of interest (COI) to participants.

Definitions:

Conflict of interest: A COI is a set of conditions in which judgement or decisions concerning a primary interest
